- Food options

Recommendations from alumni:

Speak up for what you want to see Always follow up with your supportive adult. Be present. This is going to be your home, and you want it to be the right fit. Do not leave without all your questions being answered.

What you should ask:

- Do furniture/appliances come in any rooms?
- □ What additional furniture/supplies are allowed?
- □ What does security look like at the dorm?
- What is a Resident Advisor or R.A.?
- □ When does housing close on school breaks?
- □ Can you stay over breaks? If so, does it cost extra? Is there anything open when it's closed, like food?
- □ When can you move in/move out?
- □ How does the school assign roommates?
- □ Are there coed housing opitions?
- □ Freshman requirements to live on campus? Are there expections?
