STEP ONE: FIND A TUTOR

STEP TWO: PAYMENT OPTIONS

1. The foster parent can coordinate with the person/agency to provide a monthly invoice. After the foster parent submits the invoice to OKSA@ou.edu, a check will be sent to the foster parent. The foster parent is then responsible for ensuring the tutor receives payment and submitting a receipt.



2. The foster parent can pay for the services and send in receipts to OKSA@ou.edu for reimbursement. Please call 1-800-397-2945 and let OKSA know that you will be sending in the receipts.

THE STUDENT'S SCHOOL

Check out what services are available through the local school. Teachers may be willing to help if a student needs additional support. Also, after-school programs make time for students to do their homework and may offer assistance to help with homework.

FRIENDS, FAMILY, AND NEIGHBORS

Another alternative to costly tutoring sessions is using services of friends and family. Talk to the people you know and see if anyone has knowledge of the subject where tutoring is needed. A great place to start is asking people at church, high school students, college students, retired teachers, and friends who are familiar with the subjects where tutoring is needed.

OKLAHOMA COMPLETE HEALTH (OCH) CHILDREN'S SPECIALTY PLAN

Students who receive medical coverage through the OCH Children's Specialty Plan are eligible for in-person or virtual tutoring if they are at risk of failing one or more core subject areas. Contact the youth's Care Manager for more details.

LEARN TO BE FOUNDATION

The Learn To Be Foundation is a nonprofit created to enrich students through free online tutoring. Students interact with a tutor through audio and digital chalkboards. Sessions are available from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and subjects include math, language arts and sciences. <https://www.learntobe.org/>

LOCAL LIBRARIES

Many libraries offer free tutoring sessions as well as homework help for students. These services may only be offered on certain days and some may require a signup sheet.
